Your Benefit Statement

Enclosed with this *Panel* is your current benefit statement, which provides detailed information about your JRS benefits as of June 30, 2020 and lists your current beneficiaries. Please review this information carefully.

JRS Operations Update

JRS staff is adapting to deliver the services you expect during the difficult times created by the COVID-19 pandemic and has begun the transition back to the Springfield office. Employees are subject to daily temperature checks upon arrival at work, and measures have been taken to minimize staff interaction in common areas and to allow for social distancing throughout the building.

The SRS building remains closed to visitors, and all business travel is suspended until at least January 1, 2021. As a result, no workshops or onsite counseling through the circuit courts will be scheduled. However, JRS benefit and retirement counseling will continue to be available over the telephone. Customized estimates will be prepared for and mailed to you before your conference. If you have reciprocal service, JRS may need approximately 4 to 6 weeks to consult with other retirement systems and prepare your customized estimates.

Stay Connected with JRS

The COVID-19 pandemic quickly forced JRS to adapt to working remotely. With staff working from home, email became the primary method of communicating with our members. In the next few years, we plan to transition to paperless statements and will notify our members by email when statements are available to view in their Member Services accounts.

NCPERS Special Enrollment and Open Enrollment

JRS offers a voluntary life insurance plan to its members through the [National Conference of Public Employee Retirement Systems \(NCPERS\)](#). Coverage is guaranteed with no medical questions asked. This plan provides financial protection for you and your family with a low premium of \$16 per month.

JRS is offering an open enrollment period for the voluntary group life insurance coverage to our actively working members. **Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the enrollment period is earlier this year and you can enroll now through November 30, 2020.** There is no guarantee that another open enrollment period will be offered in the future, and you can enroll only while actively working.

Member Services

1. From an Internet browser, access: memberservices.srs.illinois.gov.
The “State of Illinois Public Account Portal” will appear on the screen.
2. Click the “Create a New Account” button. The “Create a New Account” portal webpage will appear on the screen.
3. Input your “First Name”.
4. Input your “Last Name”.
5. Input your “Email Address” (business or personal email is accepted).
6. Confirm “Email Address”.
7. Input/create your “Username” in accordance with the criteria below.
8. Input/create a password in accordance with the State of Illinois Password Complexity Requirements are listed below.
9. Input “Password”.
10. Confirm “Password”.
11. Click on the “Register” button.

Username Criteria

- Must be between 6 and 20 characters in length
- May contain letters, numbers and periods
- Should not start or end with a period

Password Criteria

(Ensure caps lock is deactivated. Passwords are case sensitive).

- Minimum password length is 8 characters.
- Password may not contain your Public Login Account, First Name, or Last Name.
- Password cannot have been previously used.
- Password must contain characters from three of the following categories:
 - English UPPERCASE characters (e.g., A through Z)
 - English lowercase characters (e.g., a through z)
 - Base 10 numbers (e.g., 0 through 9)
 - Non-alphabetic characters (e.g., !, @, #, \$, &)

Tips to Create a Strong Password

- Do not use obvious passwords, like “password”, “qwerty”, “123456”, or “password1”.
- Do not use personal information, like a spouse or child’s name.
- Do not write your passwords down, and do not leave them on a sticky note on your computer monitor. Doing so removes all security the password attempts to create.
- Spell words with character substitutions, such as “!llin0i\$” instead of “Illinois”.
- The longer that the password is, the harder it will be to guess or crack.
- Do not type your passwords while using public Wi-Fi. Doing so can put your data at risk for nearby hackers.
- Use phrases to your advantage. For example, instead of using “The Early Bird Gets the Worm”, you can use “tebgtw”. You will always associate your password with the phrase, and someone looking to crack your password will have a difficult time trying to guess your password. For added difficulty, you can integrate character substitutions into the phrase, turning “tebgtw” into “t3b6tw”.
- Change your passwords regularly.
- Do not use the same password for every account.
